

 Sam. 11:13)











JEZREEL VALLEY: Israel's breadbasket






Saul receives no answer from God



David receives precise answers through Urim and Thummim

- 1 Chr. 10:1-10
- Saul's armour is stripped and his head (Heb. Golgotha) cut off by the wallowers in the dust (Philistines)
- This is a contrast to David who cut off Goliath's head, stripped off his armour and brought the head to Golgotha
- Saul's destiny is the reverse of David's
- Why?



"This sinful nature we inherit. It is our misfortune, not our crime, that we possess it. We are only blameworthy when, being supplied with the power of subduing it, we permit it to reign over us.
