




## Plagues upon the gods of Egypt

Plague	Egyptian god
Nile turned to blood	Hapi (Apis), the bull god of Nile; Isis, goddess of Nile; Khnua, ram god,
Frogs	Heqet, goddess of birth—frog head
Gnats/Lice	Set, god of desert; Kepher - god of beetles and flies
Flies/Beetles	Kepher - god of beetles and flies; Uatchit, possibly represented by fly
Murrain	Hathor, goddess with cow head; Apis, the bull god (fertility)
Boils	Sekhmet, goddess over disease; Sunu, pestilence god; Imhotep,
Hail/Storms	Nut, sky goddess; Osiris, god of crops, fertility; Set, god of storms
Locusts	Nut, sky goddess; Osiris, god of crops, fertility
Darkness	Ra, sun god; Nut, sky goddess; Hathor, sky goddess
Death of firstborn	Pharaoh considered a god

### Phenomenological Language

• The illusion or appearance of something, "the way we see it" from our perspective. As they appear to us, not necessarily as they really are.

- The sun rises and set
  - "In the heavens he has pitched a tent for the sun, which is like a bridegroom coming forth from his pavilion... It rises at one end of the heavens and makes its circuit to the other" (Psalm 19:4-6)
- Casting out a demon
  - "My son is possessed by a spirit that has robbed him of speech. Whenever it seizes him, it throws him to the ground. He foams at the mouth, gnashes his teeth and becomes rigid." Jesus rebuked the spirit: "You deaf and mute spirit, I command you to come out of him and never enter him again." (Mark 9:17-25)
