## The likely derivation of the word 'kerub'

The word 'cherub' is probably a Heemantive<sup>1</sup> noun. That is, a noun that is derived from a verb by the addition of letters to the verb. The letters which are added to form nouns are:

The Cherubim constitute a vehicle upon which Yahweh rides as in a chariot.

# The Cherubim are *ridden* by the Spirit

'And he rode upon a cherub, and did fly ...'
Psalm 18:10

'... and gold for the pattern of the chariot of the cherubims, that spread out their wings ...' 1 Chron. 28:18

#### The Cherubim are inhabited by the Spirit

'O Yahweh of hosts Elohim of Israel that inhabits\* the cherubim' Isa. 37:16

\* The KJV reads "that dwellest between the cherubim" but the preposition 'between' is not present in the original text in any such expressions. YLT renders it 'inhabiting the cherubs', and likewise Rotherham says 'inhabiting the cherubim'.

#### In a nutshell ...

The Cherubim are vehicles *in* which Yahweh reveals himself (inhabits the cherubim), and *through* which he accomplishes His will (rides the cherubim).



# The cherubim primarily reveal the outworking of God's purpose through Christ

#### God inhabited the Christ cherub

'Believest thou not that I am in the Father, and the Father in me? the words that I speak unto you I speak not of myself: but the Father that dwelleth in me, he doeth the works' John 14:10

#### God rode the Christ cherub

' ..... not my will, but thine, be done' Luke 22:42


# The outworking of God's purpose through Christ revealed in the cherubim

#### The Edenic cherubim - a protype of the tabernacle



- God appointed both as his dwelling place. Cmp. Gen.
   3:24; Ex. 25:8
- <u>Sacrifices</u> were offered at both places. **Gen. 4:3**; **Lev. 1-6**
- The Edenic cherubim were incorporated into the tabernacle. Ex. 25:18
- The orientation of both signified that there was <u>one</u> way to eternal life. Cmp. Gen. 3:24; Num. 2
- That <u>way was guarded</u>. Cmp.
   Gen. 3:22-23; Num. 1:51-53





#### To keep the way

After Adam and Eve sinned, God could have destroyed the tree of life to prevent its fruit from being eaten.

Instead it was to remain before them as a tantalizing object of hope. The continued existence of the tree showed that the attainment of immortality remained a possibility.

The Cherubim were there to reveal how that possibility could become a reality. The flaming sword prevented the reality from being achieved prematurely.

Together the Cherubim and the flaming sword kept the way of the tree of life.

#### Summary

- The cherubim in their different forms represent the same thing the outworking of God's purpose through Christ.
- Through the cherubim, God reveals both the way of the tree of life, and also the glory associated having kept the way.
- The Edenic cherubim were to the antediluvians what the tabernacle was to Israel, a schoolmaster to bring them to Christ.
- The way of the tree of life is a narrow way that has been and always will be followed by few.
- God in his mercy provided the tree of life as a tantalizing object of hope. We must make our hope equally as real.
- As prospective cherubim, we are to be keepers of the way. To keep the way we must first know it, to lead the way we must first learn to be followers of Christ.
