

The chronology of Ezekiel 1



1st captivity (606BC)

- During 3rd year of Jehoiakim, one year before Nebuchadnezzar began to reign in 605BC
- Part of the vessels of the house of Yahweh plundered (Dan 1:2)
- Princes and nobles deported (Dan 1:3)

2nd captivity (598BC)

- During 11th year of Jehoiakim King deported (2 Chron 36:6) and 3,000 Jews (Jer. 52:28)
- Vessels of the house of Yahweh plundered

3rd captivity (597BC)

- At end of reign of Jehoiachin, in 8th year of N.
- 10,000 captives taken including king, royalty, mighty men, craftsman, & smiths.
- None remained but the poorest

4th captivity (586BC)

- At end of reign of Zedekiah, 19th year of N.
- Princes, chief priests and king's counsellors were executed
- King and 832 people deported (Jer 52:29)
- Jeremiah freed from prison and given liberty
- Temple, palace, & houses of Jerusalem were burned. Vessels of gold cut in pieces.
- Walls of Jerusalem demolished
- Temple and utensils were plundered including brass, pots, shovels, snuffers, spoons, vessels, things of gold and silver

5th captivity (582BC)

- In 23rd year of Nebuchadnezzar
- 745 people deported (Jer 52:30)

Synopsis of Ezekiel 1

'The things in this chapter (Ezekiel 1) taken collectively represent the Messiah upon his throne surrounded by his saints and all energized and made glorious by the Spirit of God From this it is evident that the cherubim represent the aggregate of those redeemed from the nations in their resurrected state' J. Thomas, *Elpis Israel*, 14th Edition, p150

Key reasons why the visions of Ezekiel 1 & 10 represent Christ and the redeemed

- The one on the throne has the appearance of a man (Heb. 'adam'). This word is never used in connection with God.
- The cherubic faces are the heraldry of Christ and those who have identified with him as keepers of the way. The angels are never symbolized with cherubic faces.
- The throne and four living creatures appear again in Rev 4-5. There the living creatures sing to the lamb 'thou wast slain and hast redeemed us to God'.



FOUR LIVING CREATURES

- v5 likeness of man
- v6 4 faces and 4 wings
- v7 calf's feet like burnished brass
- v8 hands of a man under wings
 v9 wings joined
- vill faces of man, lion, ox, eagle
 vill 2 outstretched wings touched other cherub, 2 wings covered body
 vill appearance like coals of fire - as lamps burning up and down, with lightning

FOUR WHEELS


- 1:16 colour of beryl
- 1:16 wheel within a wheel
- 1:17 turned not when they went
- 1:18 were dreadfully high
- 1:18 were full of eyes
- 10:2 were under the cherubs
- 10:9 one wheel per cherub

The expanse (firmament)

Context: The wings have been let down (judgment has ceased) and a voice issues from heaven (Christ's rule has begun)

The expanse was over the heads of the cherubim 1:22,25,26;10:1	Universal dominion has been bestowed upon the redeemed who are now cherubim Cmp Isa, 35:10		
Was as the colour of terrible crystal 1:22	The clearness (righteousness) and universality of the new world order will be awe inspiring to the mortals		
There was a voice from the firmament that was over their heads 1:25	There shall come a great voice (of Christ) out of the temple of heaven from the throne saying 'It is done' Rev. 15:17

The throne above the expanse

v26 throne as sapphire stone v26 upon the throne was one in appearance like a man (adam) **v27** from his waist upward appeared as gleaming metal, from his waist downward appeared as fire, and there was brightness around him v28 there was a bright rainbow round about the throne **v28** this was the appearance of the likeness of the glory of Yahweh

Background to Ezekiel 10

- The glory of God was forced to leave the temple because it was about to be defiled by the Babylonians on account of Judah's wickedness.
- God held Judah responsible for the defilement of His *temple*, therefore *they* were going to be destroyed. On what principle - 'If any man defile the TEMPLE of God, HIM shall God destroy' 1 Cor 3:17
- What does this mean for us? '... for the temple of God is holy, which temple ye are'



Overview of Ezekiel 10

Preparations for the destruction of Jerusalem

- v1-4 The glory moves from the most holy to the threshold of Solomon's temple
- v5-8 Coals of fire from between the cherubim are given to the man in linen
- v9-11 The appearance of the wheels
- v12-14 The appearance of the living creatures
- v15-17 The motion of the living creatures and wheels
- v18-22 The glory moves from the temple to the cherubim
