
There He Spake With Us

FIRST VISIT Jacob : *Supplanter*

- His own decision to go
- Arrived alone **32:10**
- Afraid, fleeing from Esau **35:1**
- No special preparations
- Named it "Bethel" v19
- Revelation of Elohim v12
- Knew not the manifestation v16
- He dreamed (in sleep) v12
- Erects a "pillar" v18
- Anoints the pillar v18
- Promise of protection v15
- Bethel = House of Might v19

SECOND VISIT Israel : *Prince with El*

- Commanded to return v1
- Arrive with "two bands" 32:10
- A "terror" to cities **v5**
- Company purged of idols v2-4
- Named it "El-Bethel" v7
- Manifestation of El v11
- "he found him in Bethel" Hos 12:4
- God appeared unto him v9
- Establishes an altar v7
- Anoints + Drink off on pillar v14
- Promise fulfilled v3
- Beth-Elohim = House of Mighty Ones 28:22

Hosea 12:3-4 (Rotherham)

Shechem - Place of Decision

- Abram made decision to worship Yahweh
- Jacob's house decided between Yah & idols
- Joseph's brethren left for Dothan (world)
- Blessings & Cursings placed on Ebal/Gerezim
- Decision to serve Yahweh on entering land
- Joshua : "Choose whom ye will serve"
- Israel decided to follow Jereboam
- Woman of Samaria made a decision!
