
Saddam Hussein's deserted place at Babylon

The fall of Babylon foreshadowed at Jericho



- The nearby river was dried up just prior to the city's destruction Josh 3; cmp Jer 51:36
- It was commanded to "shout against her round about" for her "foundations are fallen, her walls are thrown down" Josh 6:20; cmp Jer 50:15
- > The city was conquered by one like Christ
- The city was the home of a harlot Josh 6:25; cmp Rev 17:5
- The city contained Babylonish wares Josh 7:21
- The city was rich in gold, silver, brass and iron Josh 6:19; cmp Dan 5:4
- The city would be utterly destroyed and remained uninhabited Josh 6:21,26; cmp Jer 50:13
